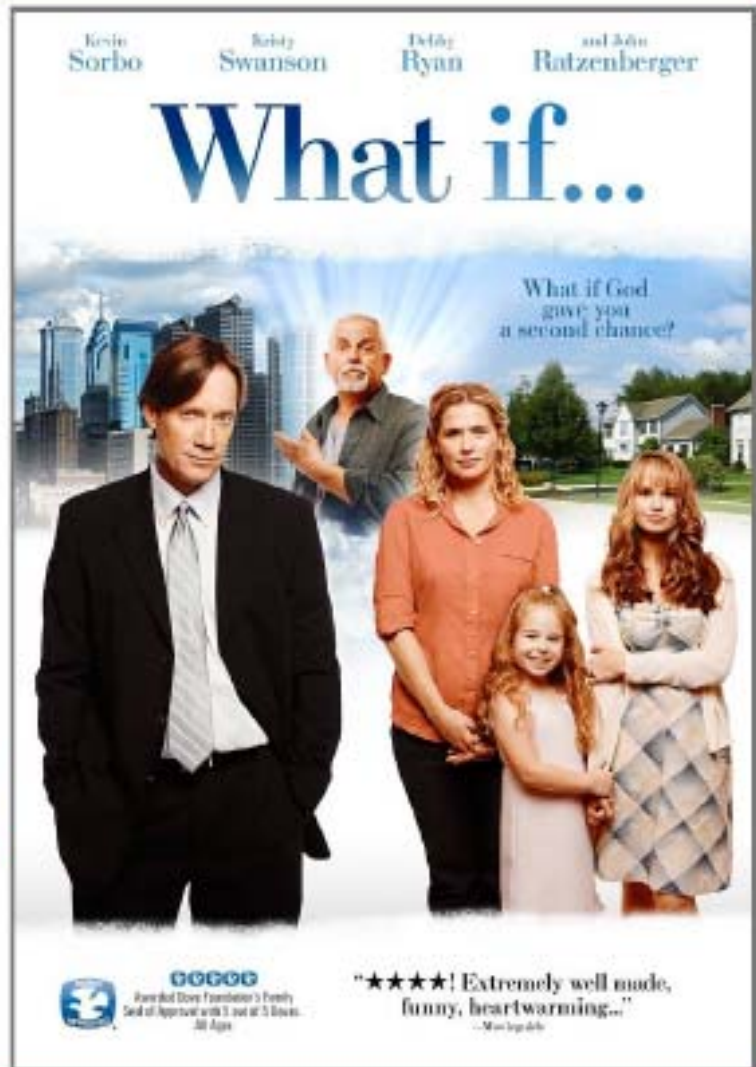

CORNER

Pineapple-Orange Sunshine Cake

- 1 box yellow cake mix
- ¾ cup applesauce
- 4 eggs
- 1 can (11oz) mandarin oranges in light syrup

FROSTING

- 1 container (8oz) light whipped topping. Thawed.
- 1 pkg (3.4 oz) instant vanilla pudding mix
- 1 can (15 ½ oz) crushed pineapple in juice (just measure 15 ½ oz)

1. For the cake: Preheat the oven to 350 F. In a large bowl, stir together all the cake ingredients until moist. Beat by hand for 2 minutes.
2. Coat a 13"x9" cake pan with cooking spray. Pour the batter into the pan. Bake for 30 to 40 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool completely.
3. For the frosting: In a large bowl, mix together all the ingredients until well blended. Spread over the cake.

Store in the refrigerator. Serves 16.

JARED BOX PROJECT

Jared boxes are plastic shoe boxes filled with toys, books and activities which are given to chronically ill children to enjoy during hospital and treatment visits. **Medical workers praise the joy each kid expresses about receiving a surprise box at a difficult time in their lives.**

Williams Community United Methodist Church youth will again pack boxes to be used at Flagstaff Medical Center. The Sunday School children and youth of the Church will pack the Boxes on Sunday, November 8, 2015.

Attached is a suggested list of appropriate things for each age level. Flagstaff Medical Center has sent word that they need more boxes for children age four and older, than for babies and younger children. **Please NO food or candy NO hair accessories, NO lotions, medicines or vitamins, and NO war-like toys (toy soldiers, play guns, etc.).** Also remember that these children will play with these items while in a hospital bed. So messy finger paint, or projects that require extensive clean-up are **not** appropriate. Other activities and small books are great! See the attached list for suggested items.

A large labeled box will be placed in the Church, in hopes that you will please donate items for these Jared boxes. Items need to be new or lightly used. Knowing a week ahead will help us plan what else to purchase. You can also donate money, and I will use it to shop for the clear plastic boxes and items not donated. <u>Age</u>	<u>Appropriate toys/items</u>
Under 2	Bibs, rattles, soft books, teething rings, booties, pacifier, sippy cup or bottle, blanket, soft animal. No tiny toys that could cause choking.
2-4	Dolls, matchbox cars, Play-Doh, crayons, coloring books, bubbles, card games, soft balls, paint set, books, puppets, poseable figurines, costume jewelry, soft animals, blankets, slippers.
4-8	Silly putty, Play-Doh, paints, books, art supplies, bubbles, card games (Uno, Old Maid, Go Fish, etc.) board games, plastic animals (dinosaurs, farm animals, etc.), cars, dress-up toys, stuffed animals, stickers, Nerf ball
8-11	Card games, paints, silly putty, calculator, silly string, gel pens, yo-yo, craft kits, brainteasers, books, art supplies, travel size games, word search puzzles, small toys, Nerf ball, calculator, notebook (small), friendship bracelet.
11 & up	Electronic games, word search/crossword puzzles, books, playing cards, craft kits, brain teaser games, journals, art supplies, nail polish, stress balls, travel size board games, calculator, bags, school supplies, markers.

Western Jurisdictional Conference

The Desert Southwest Conference will host the Western Jurisdictional Conference (WJC) in July 2016. As host Conference it is our purpose to demonstrate God’s abundant joy and grace that is present in the Desert Southwest. The WJC Worship Planning Team is asking for our assistance to do some needed work in advance of the gathering.

Volunteers are needed in the following areas:

- 1) Advanced woodworkers – we need 7 processional poles and stands made
- 2) An Advanced fabric artist to design stoles for the Bishops in cooperation with the Worship Planning Team
- 3) Seamstresses – Quilters to make vestments and banners for the Bishops
 - We need 6 stoles made
 - We also need 7 processional banners made
- 4) 2 people who will assist in putting music into Sibelius format for the worship books
- 5) 6 churches whose children will assist in making a prayer gift for the participants
- 6) 1 or 2 people to work with our team coordinator to design and create prayer spaces for the gathering
- 7) Dozens of volunteers who will help with Hospitality/Greeting at the airport or hotel.
- 8) Dozens of volunteers who will help with ground transportation between the hotel and airport.
- 9) Volunteer nurses, EMTs, or doctors (i.e., active or retired medical personnel) to staff a medical station.
- 10) Volunteers to help with a field trip to the Heard Museum.
- 11) Volunteers to assist with gift baskets and other needs.

Focus On:

Not Sew Perfect Quilters

On most Tuesday afternoons at 1:00 pm, a group of people get together to work on quilts that are donated to various organizations. Past donations have been given to the Prescott Veterans Hospital, Faithworks, homeless shelters in Flagstaff, and various people heading out on overseas missions. While the current group working on quilts is women, we have had men in the past, and welcome anyone who wants to contribute their time in this activity.

In addition to meeting on Tuesdays at 1:00 pm, we also have tasks that can be done at home. On the information table there is a metal basket containing quilt kits that can be picked up and sewn at home. Each kit includes pre-cut squares and an instruction sheet on how the squares are to be sewn together. The easiest kits to sew together are the “checkerboard” style kits. And there is a “help” phone number to call if you have additional questions or any issues with the kit. To sew these kits, you need access to a sewing machine and a little bit of sewing experience.

No sewing or quilting experience is necessary on Tuesdays, as we will teach you the different steps in creating these quilts. Basically we take the completed tops, find matching material for the backings, layer the back, batting, and top, and then tie the layers together.

Where do our supplies come from? All the fabric we have has been donated to us. Any fabric donated that can't be used for quilts is given to others. We purchase the batting used in the quilts. The batting is purchased by the roll (approx. \$125 each) and lasts approximately 2-4 months. We also sell some of our quilts at the Fall Bazaar. These sales and donations currently provide money to purchase batting for the rest of the year. For more information, contact Rua.

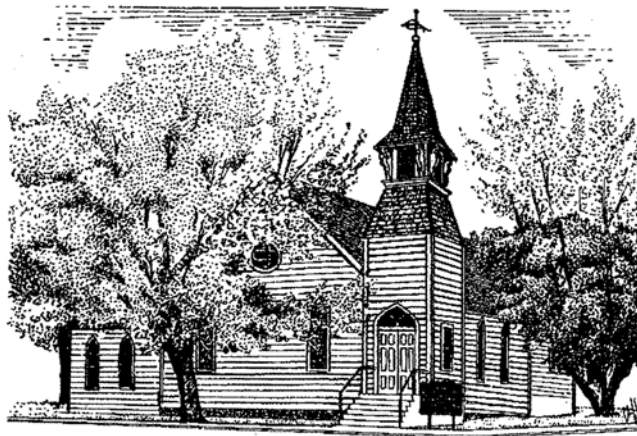
